Flag, ribbon and badge guideline

- 2 Flag, ribbon and badge guideline lists the symbols of the Association and acknowledgements
- 3 and rules of admitting and using them.

4 01 The symbols of the Association

- 5 1 § The symbol of the Association
- 6 The symbol of the Association is made up of the Caduceus and the letter A from Turku's coat
- 7 of arms. The abbreviation of the Association can be used in connection with the symbol, as is
- 8 expressed in the rules of the Association.
- 9 2 § The flag of the Association
- 10 The flag of the Association has the base color of dark blue and has the symbol of the
- 11 Association in gold. The size of the flag is $140 \times 110 \text{ cm}$.
- 12 1. The use of the flag
- 13 The flag is used in the events of the Association. The use of the flag in other academic events
- 14 is decided on by the Board of the Association.
- 15 2. Carrying the flag
- 16 When using the flag of the Association without a cover, the flag should always have a two-
- 17 person herald or a guard of honor. When carrying the flag with another flag, the rules of said
- 18 flag can also be followed.
- 19 3. The clothing of the flag bearer and the heralds
- 20 The flag bearer and the heralds dress according to the nature of the event and wear
- 21 graduation caps. The heralds use herald's sash in the colors of the Association or in the colors
- 22 white and blue such as in the Finnish flag. The sash is worn so, that for one it goes over the
- 23 left shoulder and for the other it goes over the right shoulder, going cross-body to the opposite
- 24 hip. The sash is tied a bit below the waist. In a white and blue sash, blue is on the bottom. The
- 25 heralds position themselves in relation to the flag bearer so that the sashes form the letter A
- around the flag bearer.
- 4. Saluting with the flag
- 28 The flag of the Association salutes the head of state, the Finnish flag, the national anthem and
- 29 the deceased by the flag bearer lowering the flag calmly to a 45-degree angle and then
- 30 immediately lifting it up. The flag cannot touch the ground.
- 31 3 § The coat of arms of the Association

- 32 In the coat of arms of the Association there is silver lilies and a golden Caduceus on a blue
- 33 shield. The lilies on the coat of arms act as a connection to Turku and the Caduceus acts as a
- 34 connection to economics.

02 The member symbols of the Association

- 36 4 § The Association badge
- 37 The Association badge has the symbol of the Association on it. It is gold-plated silver and is
- 38 the height of 10 mm. The Association badge can be used by all the members of the
- 39 Association. The Board can grant the Association badge as a recognition to a person outside of
- 40 the Association. The Association badge is worn on the left lapel and is also worn in other
- 41 events besides the academic ones.
- 42 5 § The Association ribbon
- 43 The colors of the Association ribbon are dark blue and gold. The Association ribbon is 21 mm
- 44 wide. The Association ribbon can be worn by all members of the Association in academic
- 45 events. The Board can grant the Association ribbon as a recognition to a person outside of the
- 46 Association to be worn in academic events.
- With a tailcoat or other evening attire, the Association ribbon is worn from the right shoulder
- 48 over the chest to the left. With an evening gown or other dress, the Association ribbon is worn
- 49 from the left shoulder over the chest to the right. With a tailcoat or other evening attire the
- ribbon is worn under the waistcoat. With an evening gown or other dress, the Association
- ribbon can be worn either on top of the dress in a way that it isn't in touch with bare skin, or
- as a rosette in the left lapel.
- 53 Nothing should be attached to the Association ribbon unless specifically designated to be
- 54 attached.
- 55 6 § The cap of the Association
- 56 1. The cap of the Association
- 57 The cap of the Association is a Finnish graduation cap that has the cap symbol of the
- 58 Association in its black velvet trim. The lining of the cap of the Association can be in the colors
- of the Association, dark blue and gold.
- 2. The cap symbol of the Association
- 61 The cap symbol of the Association is the gold plated and 18 mm tall symbol of the Association.
- The cap symbol of the Association can be used by all the current and past members of the
- 63 Association. The symbol is attached in the front and middle of the black velvet rim of the
- 64 graduation cap.
- 65 3. The use of the Association's badge of merit and the Board badge on the cap of the
- 66 Association
- 67 The Association's silver and gold badges of merit, the golden badge of honor, the alumni
- badge and the Board badge can be worn in the black velvet trim of the cap of the Association
- 69 in a way that the highest-ranking badge is within a three-finger-distance of the cap symbol of
- 70 the Association on the left-side temple of the cap bearer.
- 71 4. The right of use of the cap

- 72 All current members of the Association, as well as past members of the Association or The
- 73 Student Union of Turku School of Economics are entitled to wear the cap of the Association,
- values the Board has forbidden it. The Assembly of the Association can grant the right to use
- 75 the cap as a recognition to a person outside of what was described previously.

03 The official badges of the Association

- 77 7 § The chain of the honorary supervisor
- 78 The chain of the honorary supervisor is worn by the executive director during their term of
- 79 office in academic events.

- 80 8 § The chain of the Chairperson of the Association
- 81 The chain of the Chairperson of the Association is worn by the Chairperson of the Board during
- 82 their term of office in academic events.
- 9 § The Board badge
- The Board badge is gold plated, 15 mm in diameter, symbol of the Association inside a circle.
- 85 The Board badge can be worn by all members who have served in the Board of the Association
- 86 or as the executive director of the Association.
- 87 The badge is worn on the left lapel or on the Board ribbon in academic or other events. The
- 88 Board badge is worn on the Board ribbon during the Board member's or executive director's
- term of office. After that, the badge is worn on the left lapel as is specified in 26 §.
- 90 10 § The Board ribbon
- 91 The colors of the Board ribbon are the same as the Association ribbons. The Board ribbon is 34
- 92 mm wide. The Board ribbon can be used in academic events by all members who have served
- 93 in the Board of the Association or as the executive director of the Association. The Board
- 94 ribbon is carried in the same manner as the Association ribbon.
- 95 11 § The keys
- 96 The keys are carried by the annual ball producers during their term in office in academic
- 97 events.

- 98 12 § The wand
- 99 The wand is used by an annual ball producer, the master of ceremonies or other person
- appointed by the Board during official duties.

04 The recognitions of the Association

- 102 13 § Granting the recognitions
- 103 The recognitions of the Association can be granted by the Board of the Association by the
- 104 suggestion of The Honorary Council. The Maija Grundström -medal and the title of honorary

- inspector can be granted only with the decision of the Association's Assembly and by the
- 106 suggestion of The Honorary Council. The Board can either accept the suggestion of The
- 107 Honorary Council or return the suggestion to preparation.
- 108 The Honorary Council is chosen in the spring Assembly, and it includes six to eight members of
- the Association. The Chairpersons of the present and previous boards and the Head of Culture
- and Traditions have a mandate seat in The Honorary Council. The Chairperson of the previous
- 111 Board acts as the Chairperson of The Honorary Council. In addition to the above-mentioned
- members, two to four members of the Association are chosen to be in The Honorary Council.
- 113 14 § Kyploomi
- 114 A Kyploomi can be granted to active members of the Association after completing their degree
- in Economics and Business Administration. The Kyploomi's are distributer in the Master's
- 116 Ceremony.
- 117 15 § The standard of the Association
- 118 The standard of the Association is a 12,5 x 17 cm sized miniature flag made of silk and has the
- 119 symbol of the Association embroidered on it. A name plate of the receiver is attached to the
- 120 pedestal of the standard.
- 121 The standard can be granted as a recognition to a community or a private person.
- 122 16 § The golden flask
- 123 The golden flask can be granted to a member of the Association who is distinguished in the
- 124 activity of the Association.
- 125 17 § The alumni badge
- 126 The alumni badge is an 18 mm tall bronze coat of arms of the Association. The badge can be
- 127 granted to the alumni of the Association. The alumni badge is worn on the left lapel and used
- only in academic events. The badge can be worn in the cap of the Association in other than
- academic events, as is further determined in 6 §. The badge can be granted to an alumnus of
- the Association for long-term merits for developing the Association and its ties or to an
- alumnus who has significantly advocated for the Association's interests after graduation in
- 132 other ways.
- 133 18 § The silver badge of merit
- 134 The silver badge of merit is the silver-colored, 18 mm tall symbol of the Association. The silver
- badge of merit can be granted to a present or past member of the Association who is
- distinguished in Association activities. The silver badge of merit is worn on the left lapel and is
- used also in other than academic events. The badge can also be worn in the cap of the
- 138 Association as is further determined in 6 ξ.
- 139 19 § The golden badge of merit
- 140 The golden badge of merit is the gold plated, 18 mm tall symbol of the Association. The golden
- badge of merit can be granted to a present or past member of the Association who is
- distinguished in Association activities. The badge is worn on the left lapel and is used only in

- academic events. The badge can also be worn in the cap of the Association as is further
- 144 determined in 6 §.
- 145 20 § The honorary ribbon
- 146 The honorary ribbon is colored the same way as the Association ribbon. The honorary ribbon is
- 147 50 mm wide. The honorary ribbon can be granted to a distinguished person or community.
- The honorary ribbon is used only in academic events and is worn on the right shoulder, over
- 149 the chest and to the left.
- 150 21 § The golden badge of honor
- 151 The golden badge of honor is the gold plated, 30 mm tall symbol of the Association. The
- golden badge of honor can be granted to a person who has received the honorary ribbon for
- 153 outstanding merits.
- 154 The golden badge of honor is worn on the left lapel or the honorary ribbon and is used only in
- academic events. The badge can be worn in the cap of the Association and also in other than
- academic events as is further determined in 6 §.
- 157 22 § The Maija Grundström -medal
- 158 The Maija Grundström -medal is a raised design bronze medal that is 55 mm in diameter. A
- numbered series of thirty-five (35) medals have been made.
- 160 The Maija Grundström -medal is granted by the Assembly of the Association with the
- recommendation of The Honorary Council to an honorary member who has received the golden
- badge of honor. The medal is granted for exceptionally great merits in favor of the Association.
- 163 23 § The honorary inspector of the Association
- 164 A person who has long served as a link between the Association and the business community
- and has demonstrated significant merit in this role may be elected as the honorary inspector of
- 166 the Association.
- 167 The title and symbols of the honorary inspector can be granted by the Assembly of the
- 168 Association with the recommendation of The Honorary Council. The symbols of the honorary
- inspector are used in academic events.
- 170 Only one person at the time can be the honorary inspector of the Association. The position of
- 171 the honorary inspector is for life.
- 172 24 § Teacher of the year
- 173 The Board of the Association can grant the title of teacher of the year to a distinguished
- teacher. The recognition is given at the annual ball of the Association, if possible.

175 **05 Special regulations**

176 25 § Previous merits

- Work done for the benefit of The Student Union of the Turku School of Economics is
- 178 considered, when applicable, when granting the Association's recognitions.
- 179 26 § Wearing the ribbons and badges
- 180 In the events of Association of Economics Students in Turku and as a representative of the
- 181 Association the ribbons and badges of other student organizations are worn as their guidelines
- state, yet below the ribbons and badges of the Association. Only one of the Association's
- ribbons is worn at a time. All the badges granted as a recognition by the Association can be
- worn simultaneously. Badges of merit are worn in the left lapel of the wearer in a way that the
- highest-ranking badge is on the leftmost side when viewed from the front. The Board badge is
- worn on the Board ribbon during the term of office and at other times on the left lapel of the
- wearer, on the right-side of possible badges of merit when viewed from the front. In case the
- ribbon is worn as a rosette, badges are worn beneath the rosette. With a tailcoat or other
- evening attire the badges of merit are worn at the location of the breast pocket. The golden
- 190 badge of honor is worn on the honorary ribbon.
- 191 The badges of merit can also be worn on the cap of the Association as is further determined in
- 192 6 ξ.
- 193 27 § Disused badges
- 194 The receiver of a badge is allowed to use disused badges for their entire lifetime.
- 195 28 § Registering the granted badges
- 196 The Executive Director of the Association obligated to keep a record of the granted
- 197 recognitions.
- 198 29 § Instructions on the use of the badges
- 199 The receiver of the recognition is given instructions on the use of the badges when receiving
- 200 the badge.
- 201 30 § Changing the guideline document
- 202 Changes to this guideline document is decided by the Assembly of the Association by a simple
- 203 majority of the votes that have been cast.
